Question 1

- · Your English teacher has asked you to write a story.
- Your story must have the following title:
 The discovery of a new programming language

Tips for question 1: you can set your story either in the past or in the future. Remember to create a context for the story, describe the events with the appropriate tense, and write an appropriate ending.

- **a.** The story is set in the past: use the past simple for the main events, the past continuous to describe the setting, the past perfect for flashbacks and would + bare infinitive for anticipations (flash forwards).
- **b.** The story is set in the future: use will + bare infinitive for the main events, the future continuous for the setting, the future perfect to express anteriority.

Question 2

- This is part of an email you received from your English friend Mark.
 I have just downloaded Ubuntu onto my computer. It's fantastic!
 Have you ever tried it? Which operating system do you use? Why?
- Now write an email to Mark, telling him if you have ever tried Ubuntu and which operating system you use and why.

Tips for question 2: remember to include a greeting in your email (*Dear/Hi/Hello...*,) and refer to the email received (Thank you/ *Thanks for your email...*). End the email in the appropriate way (*Write back soon/Love...*).
